

MSPMED Workshop - Towards the operationalization of a MSP Community of Practices in the Western Mediterranean Terms of Reference

Terms of Reference

Background

Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) emerged worldwide as an important policy tool for planning the different uses and activities of Seas and Oceans efficiently, in order to achieve both a sustainable development of the Blue economy and a long-lasting safeguarding of marine resources. MSP is also recognized as a useful tool to strengthen cross-border cooperation and to support improved ocean governance among countries, in order to avoid different kinds of conflicts. The Mediterranean Sea represents a very complex and delicate area, both for the intense maritime uses and the very differentiated environmental-marine characteristics. The overarching objective of the MSPMED project (Towards the operational implementation of MSP in our common Mediterranean Sea) is to facilitate coherent MSP implementation in the Mediterranean region by enhancing cooperation and knowledge sharing, finally ensuring coherence among the MS' plans. The activities are built around specific intensive workshops, prepared by the Consortium partners, which have also the function to share best practices and approaches. The project has been a strong proposer of the development of a Mediterranean approach to MSP, able to implement not only the science based and Ecosystem Based Approaches but consider economic and cultural assets key to the Mediterranean societies.

Work program context - Work Package 4

The workshop described by this Terms of Reference (ToRs) is framed in the "Work Package 4: Cooperation among Member States and with third countries" (WP4) of the MSPMED project Work program. As established in the Grant Agreement of MSPMED, the main objective of WP4 is to set up activities able to foster a concrete cooperation on MSP and related matters between countries of southern and northern shores of the Mediterranean. This WP allows to carry out joint activities on selected topics and sectors of common interest and is an opportunity to share methodologies, results and best practices. The specific task of concern from this WP will be Task 4.3. "Establishing transboundary cooperation mechanisms and instruments with third countries" which is composed by three subtasks being the one conceptualized in this ToR, subtask 4.3.2.:

- 4.3.1 Activities between Spain-Algeria-Morocco. Consultation/seminar/workshop activities between Spain-Algeria-Morocco.
- 4.3.2 Pan-Western Mediterranean workshop between Italy, France, Spain, Malta, as Member States and Morocco, Algeria and Tunisia.
- 4.3.3. Pan- Eastern Mediterranean workshop between Italy Greece, Slovenia, Croatia, Cyprus and Lebanon, Israel and Turkey.





Also, according to the MSPMED GA, in addition to those directly involved, representatives of other Member States may participate in the activities. Representatives of UNEP-MAP, including the Institute PAP-RAC, will be invited, too. Furthermore, the events will be open to other third countries' participants.

Workshop objectives

<u>Countries to be involved</u>: The Grant Agreement of MSPMED identifies 7 beneficiaries' countries for this activity: Italy, France, Spain, Malta, Morocco, Algeria and Tunisia (from now on "involved countries"). The participation is open for other countries' representatives surrounding the Mediterranean as well as for countries part of the 5 x 5' initiatives as Mauritania and Portugal.

The main objective of this workshop will be to foster collaboration and networking and **share technical knowledge**, **experiences and tools** regarding one or various selected topics (see Annex 1) related to MSP and Blue Economy among representatives of the countries involved in the event. Effort will be invested in capitalize from and operationalize existing and past initiatives' objectives (i.e. MSPglobal, BlueMed Initiative, Mission Starfish 2030, etc.). In this regard, links may be created with the following initiatives for the organization and development of this event:

- 5' x 5' initiative
- WestMED Assistance mechanism
- Union for the Mediterranean (UfM)
- UNEP-MAP (PAP-RAC)
- EU MSP Assistance Mechanism
- IOC-UNESCO MSP initiative
- DG-RTD/MARE (Mission: Restore our Ocean and Waters, MED Lighthouse etc)
- Bluemed Initiative

This workshop will also support the creation of a Community of Practices for MSP within the WestMED Initiative as follow up discussions started in the WestMED Hackathon in Malta, on June 2022.

Description:

The ambition is to prepare a **face to face** event in order to discuss about topics selected related to MSP and Blue Economy among technicians from the involved countries. To decide about the topics to be addressed, a questionnaire was sent to MSPMED partners with different proposals in order to survey partners' interests prior the design of the workshop. Annex 1 include the topics with the links identified with other initiatives



Expected outcomes

- The workshop should serve as a platform for networking and to share experiences and lessons learnt among participants from the involved countries.
- The event is expected to reinforce the definition of a Mediterranean approach to MSP specifically by contributing to the creation of a Community of Practices (CoP) on MSP in the framework of the WestMED initiative, open for the rest of the Mediterranean.
- In the sharing of knowledge, opportunities might be identified for the different countries to address their respective MSP processes and Blue Economy strategies.
- Potential synergies for future collaborations might be identified.
- Identification of recommendations for a coherent MSP across borders will be sought.
- A report will be elaborated explaining the methodology conducted in the organization of the workshop and the main conclusions. This report will contribute to Deliverable no 40 of MSPMED project.
